

### **Easter the Birthday of Eternal Hope**

Dear friends, Easter is the greatest feast in the Catholic Church. It marks the birthday of our eternal hope. "Easter" literally means "the feast of fresh flowers." We celebrate it with pride and jubilation for three reasons:

1) The Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our Christian Faith, for it proves that Jesus is God. That is why St. Paul writes: "If Christ has not been raised,

then our preaching is in vain; and your Faith is in vain... And if Christ has not been raised, then your Faith is a delusion, and you are still lost in your sins... But in fact, Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" (1Cor 15:14,17,20). "Jesus is


Lord; He is risen!" (Rom 10:9) was the central theme of the kerygma (or "preaching"), of the apostles. It is the crowning truth of our Faith in Christ, a Faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community.

- 2) Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection. Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the Resurrection and the Life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies" (Jn 11:25-26). By virtue of the Holy Spirit, our Christian life is already a participation in the death and Resurrection of Christ.
- 3) Easter is a feast which gives us hope and encouragement in this world of pain, sorrows, and tears. It reminds us that life is worth living. It is our belief in the Real Presence of the Risen Jesus, in our souls, in His Church, in the Blessed Sacrament, and in Heaven that gives meaning to our personal, as well as to our common, prayers. Our trust in the all-pervading presence of the Risen Lord gives us strength to fight against temptations and freedom from unnecessary worries and fears.

## There are few reasons why we should believe in the Resurrection of Jesus:

(a) Jesus himself testified to his Resurrection from the dead (Mk 8:31; Mt 17:22; Lk 9:22).

(b) The tomb was empty on Easter Sunday (Lk 24:3). Although the guards claimed (Mt



28:13) that the disciples of Jesus had stolen the body, every sensible Jew knew that it was impossible for

the terrified disciples of Jesus to steal the body of Jesus from a tomb guarded by a sixteenmember team of armed Roman soldiers.

(c) The initial disbelief of Jesus' own disciples in his Resurrection, despite his repeated apparitions. This serves as a strong proof of his Resurrection. It explains why the apostles

started preaching the resurrected Christ only after receiving the anointing of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost.

- (d) The transformation of Jesus' disciples: The disciples of Jesus were almost immediately transformed from men who were hopeless and fearful after the crucifixion (Lk 24:21, Jn 20:19) into men who were confident and bold witnesses of the Resurrection (Acts 2:24; 3:15; 4:2).
- (e) The Jews and the Romans could not disprove Jesus' Resurrection by presenting the dead body of Jesus.
- (f) The apostles and early Christians would not have faced martyrdom if they were not absolutely sure of Jesus' Resurrection.
- (g) The Apostle Paul's conversion from a persecutor of Christians into a zealous apostle, preaching the Good News of Jesus throughout much of the Gentile world supports the truth of Jesus' Resurrection (Gal 1:11-17, Acts 9:1; 9:24-25; Acts 26:15-18).
- (h) The sheer existence of a thriving, empire-conquering early Christian Church, bravely facing three centuries of persecution, supports the truth of the Resurrection claim.
- (i) The New Testament witnesses do not bear the stamp of dupes or deceivers. The apostles and the early Christians were absolutely sure about the Resurrection of Jesus.

As a parish we are invited to strengthen our faith in the risen Lord and conquer ourselves, the other and attain the eternal life in Christ. Let us overcome our differences by learning the truth about Jesus how he washed their feet saying, "If I, therefore, the master and teacher, have washed your feet, you ought to wash one another's feet. I have given you a model to follow, so that as I have done for you, you should also do." (Jn 13:12-15). Let us sit together as a family as Jesus sat for the Last Supper, and invited his disciples by giving the bread saying,

"Take and eat; this is my body." By giving the cup to them saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed on behalf of many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, from now on I shall not drink this fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it with you new in the kingdom of my Father." (Mt 26:26-29). Jesus died on the cross to raise us all to experience the glory of God. May this Easter be an experience of the risen Lord walking with us to renewed faith and hope.

### Are We Pilgrims of Hope or Hopeless Pilgrims?

Life is a pilgrimage—an uncharted journey filled with trials, triumphs, and the unknown. As Catholics, we walk by faith, but what happens when the road ahead is covered in shadows? Do we press forward with hope, trusting in God's plan, or do we sink into despair, convinced we are lost? This question is not just



philosophical; it is spiritual. It defines how we live, how we endure suffering, and ultimately, where we are headed.

**Hope** is not a fleeting emotion; it is a force. It is what drives the weary forward, lifts the broken, and rekindles the fire in a soul dimmed by sorrow. It is the anchor that holds firm even when the waves of life rage around us: "We have this hope as an anchor of the soul, firm and secure." (Hebrews 6:19). History proves that God's people have always walked by this unshakable hope. The Israelites wandered the desert but never lost sight of the Promised Land. The early Christians faced persecution but held onto the promise of eternal life. They knew what we must remember today—God never abandons His people. Hope is like a rocket—it propels us beyond our struggles, defying gravity, breaking through the barriers of doubt and fear. Scripture tells us: "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength; they will soar on wings like eagles." (Isaiah 40:31). Hope is our fuel, our power source. It gets us off the ground, carries us through uncertainty, and gives us the strength to take the leap of faith toward God's promise.

But what if we let go of hope? What if the weight of our fears, failures, and doubts drags us down? **Hopelessness** is not just sadness—it is spiritual blindness. It makes us believe that God is absent, that our suffering is pointless, that there is no way forward. This is a dangerous path, one the Catechism of the Catholic Church warns against (CCC 2091). But Scripture reminds us: "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair." (2 Corinthians 4:8). Judas Iscariot lost himself in despair, believing his betrayal of Christ was unforgivable. Peter, too, failed Jesus—but he chose hope, sought mercy, and became the rock on which Christ built

His Church (Matthew 16:18). The difference between them was not the weight of their sin, but the presence—or absence—of hope. Let us choose to walk in hope. As Pope Francis boldly proclaims, "Hope is bold." It does not shrink back; it steps forward. It does not whisper; it declares. We are not alone—God walks with us: "For I know

the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)

Hope is a choice. It is found in prayer, strengthened through the sacraments, and lived out in acts of love. It is the light we carry, not just for ourselves, but for the world.

In conclusion: **Hope or Hopelessness? The Choice is Ours**. Every journey has a direction. Every heart has a compass. Every soul must choose. Are we pilgrims of hope, pressing on with faith? Or are we hopeless wanderers, losing ourselves in despair?

The answer is in Christ. If we anchor ourselves in Him, we will never be lost. If we hold onto hope, we will always find our way. "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." (Romans 12:12)

Now, ask yourself—what kind of pilgrim are you?

On this note, we wish you a blessed holy week and Happy Easter. God bless!

### THE JUBILEE YEAR 2025

The Jubilee 2025, with its theme "Pilgrims of Hope", is a significant spiritual event rooted in ancient traditions. It offers an opportunity for profound personal and collective renewal through pilgrimage,



the symbolic act of crossing the Holy Door, the reception of plenary indulgence, and the active practice of Works of Mercy. The theme "Pilgrims of Hope" is particularly relevant in a world facing war, the ongoing impacts of the pandemic, and climate change. The Jubilee is presented as a time for hope and trust in God.

Pope Francis calls on all believers to embrace this time of grace, embark on a journey of conversion, and become authentic witnesses of hope in the world. He further emphasizes the importance of "Works of Mercy as an integral part of the Jubilee experience." These include both corporal and spiritual works, inviting believers to "reach out to our brothers and sisters in difficulty bearing witness to Divine Mercy with concrete gestures." Examples include helping the hungry, welcoming those in difficulty, consoling the suffering, and forgiving those who have hurt us. He describes the Jubilee as "a special time to let our hearts Be touched by Grace, to open ourselves to hope and trust in God who never disappoints." It is a "powerful invitation to rediscover the deepest meaning of our faith and to become witnesses of hope in a world often marked by conflict, fear and confusion." He reminds us, "we are not men and women of fear but of Hope." The Jubilee began on December 24th, 2024 (Christmas Eve) with

the solemn opening of the Holy Door of St. Peter's Basilica by Pope Francis. The Holy Year will end exactly one year later on **December 24th**, **2025**. The concept of the Jubilee has ancient

roots in Jewish tradition, where every 50 years was dedicated to the "rest of the earth and the renewal of society." This involved the resting of the land, cancellation of debts, freeing of slaves, and the return of expropriated lands, signifying a time of great joy and celebration but also of deep reflection focused on justice, mercy, and solidarity. The first official Christian Jubilee was proclaimed in 1300 by Pope Boniface VIII, initially intended to be celebrated every hundred years. The frequency of Jubilees was later revised to every 50 years, aligning with the Jewish tradition and eventually settled at ordinary Jubilees every 25 years. This aims to allow each generation to experience this event at least once.

Pope Francis has asked us to prepare for this Jubilee year by studying four documents of the Second Vatican Council (Sacrosanctum Concilium, Lumen Gentium, Dei Verbum, and Gaudium et Spes) and praying for this Jubilee year. The Jubilee is a call for believers to return to the Lord with all their heart through prayer, listening to the Gospel and spiritual formation. We are called to a journey of conversion which means returning to the Lord with all our heart. We can do this through concrete gestures such as daily prayer, attentive listening to the gospel and a deeper spiritual formation.

### ST. THERESE - A CLOISTERED MISSIONARY.

St Therese of the Child Jesus popularly known as the "LITTLE FLOWER OF JESUS" and is fondly loved by all those who invoke her intercession. She bloomed into a great missionary inside the four walls of the Carmelite Monastery of Lisieux, France.

This year 2025, marks the Jubilee year of Jesus birth, and the Centenary year of the


Canonisation of St. Therese on 17<sup>th</sup> May 1925. Though she was a Cloistered Nun, she was declared *Patroness of Missions* along with St. Francis Xavier. She is considered one of the greatest saints of modern times. Countless women, men, priests, religious, youth, believers and non-believers of all ages and generations have experienced the power of her intercession. The spirituality of St. Therese is very simple and can be embraced by one and all, that is *total trust and confidence in God the Father.* 

St. Therese was the youngest daughter of the Martin family of Louis and Zelie. They had nine children: Louise, Pauline, Leonie, Helen (died at 5 years), Marie Joseph Louis (died at 5 months), Marie Joseph Baptiste (died at 9 months), Celine, Melanie Therese (died at 3 months), and lastly Therese, who was born on 2<sup>nd</sup> January 1873 in Alencon (France). Louise and Pauline joined the Carmel of Lisieux. They were also the source of inspiration for Therese to join Carmel. At the age of fifteen, St. Therese joined Carmel while her older sister Celine stayed back to look after their aged and sick father. Later after his death, she too joined Carmel at Lisieux. Marie Leonie, her older sister joined the Visitation sisters, another Congregation.

The parents of St. Therese, Louis and Zelie were canonised on 15<sup>th</sup> October 2015 in Rome by Pope Francis during the World Synod of Bishops on the Family. The Pope said that they are the Models for our parents today.

St. Therese was not a born Saint. She was like most of us with all her faults, weakness, and human infirmities (psychological, emotional, spiritual and physical). But in all her brokenness, God granted her grace to soar high through a life of virtue and sacrifice.

\* Therese had intestinal troubles after two weeks of her birth. Her condition became worse, and the mother



\* When Therese was four years old, her beloved mother died to breast cancer. She tightly embraced her sister Pauline, saying, "you will be my mother". However, Pauline

left home to join Carmel when Therese was nine years old, after she received her first Holy Communion. Therese suffered very much emotionally, and this affected her physical health too, with severe headaches. She expresses her sorrow in her Autobiography, "STORY OF A SOUL".

- \* Her father Mr. Martin loved his youngest daughter very much. He called Therese his queen. Yet silently, she separated from him to join Carmel and dedicate her life entirely to God.
- \* St. Therese joined Carmel at the age of fifteen and as she was being clothed with the Carmelite Habit after one year, her beloved father fell seriously ill. Therese suffered very much. But she offered her pain and sorrow to the Heavenly Father in a spirit of faith, and surrendered her beloved Papa into God's loving embrace. After three years of intense suffering, he died. Her older sister Celine joined the Carmel of Lisieux.

These are a few instances of how, a great Saint, despite her many difficulties, trials and challenges of life, kept the flame of her faith burning. Therese lived a child-like spirituality and offered her life of prayer, sacrifice, silence and solitude, all out of great love for God, in the Cloister of Carmel for the salvation of souls. Jesus while hanging on the cross said, "I THIRST". Therese understood this as, Jesus thirsting for souls. So, today, St. Therese is invites all of us, both young and old to join in her mission to save souls and to quench the thirst of Jesus.

In the Archdiocese of Mumbai, the Carmelite sisters have a cloistered convent at Andheri. If St. Therese (the little Flower of Jesus), could answer the call of God at such a tender age of 15 years, WHY NOT YOU? The call of Jesus is always there. 2025 years ago, when Jesus called his first disciples, Simon Peter, Andrew, and others,

### DARE TO DREAM WITH SAINT JOSEPH

In the Year 2013, Fr. Dominic Vas built an Infant Jesus Shrine to promote the devotion of Infant Jesus of Prague and it was inaugurated by Bishop Bosco Penna. In the same year Fr. Roshan D Souza joined the Parish team as assistant priest and Fr. Agnelo who served as an assistant priest left for Prague for his further mission.

In the year 2014, after the Provincial Chapter, Fr. Michael Morris and Fr. Ivo left for the Margao community for their further mission. Fr. Dominic Vas, who was the Parish Priest, was transferred to Mysore, to Dhyanavana Spirituality centre. Fr. Ivan went to Shivamogga for his new assignment. A new community was formed in Mira Road under the leadership of Fr. Diogo Proenca. Fr. Nelson Pinto who was appointed as the Parish priest took charge of St. Joseph Church, Mira Road. Fr. Lancy Mendonca, Fr. Denis Misquith and Newly ordained priest Fr. Daniel Christian joined the Parish Team as assistant priests. In the year 2015 Fr. Roshan who served as the assistant priest left for Canada for his new mission.

In the year 2015 in May Fr. Nelson who served as a Parish Priest left for Gulbarga for his new assignment, and Fr. Melvin D Cunha took the reins of St. Joseph Church Mira Road from Fr. Nelson. In the same year, Fr. Joachim Rodrigues too joined the Parish community as an assistant Priest. In January 2016, 3 Deacons namely Antony Stephen, Kevin Fernandes, Prakash Rebello came to St. Joseph Church Mira Road to assist in the pastoral ministry. They continued their ministry till April 2016.

On July 17, 2016, the Mount Carmel School came into existence with the permission Maharashtra Education Board and Diocese of Mumbai. Fr. Victor Vijay Pais was appointed as the first principal of Mount Carmel School.

In 2017 after the provincial Chapter, a New community at Krista Shanti Dham, Mira road was formed under the leadership of Fr. Lawrence D'Cunha, Frs. Walter D Souza, Cannio Cardoza and Pawan Saldanha joined the Parish team. Fr. Pawan was also appointed as the Principal of Mount Carmel School. Fr. Diogo was transferred to Rajodi. Fr. Victor for Dhyanavana Spirituality Centre. Fr. Joachim who was appointed as the Education secretary, and left for Bangalore. Father Daniel Christian left for Rome for his higher studies. Fr. Dennis Misquith left for Londa as the Principal of Mount Carmel School Ramnagar. In October, Deacon Antony Souza came to Mira Road for the diaconate ministry and served in the parish for six months.

In the year 2017, Fr. Melvin the parish priest along with Finance committee and the priest's team took up many tasks like tiling the entire staircase, tiling the Avila Room, Little flower Room and T.V. Room. The church and the whole building were painted and were given a new look. Two jumbo fans were installed in the church. In the same year, we demolished the old grotto which was beyond repair and was causing inconvenience at the entrance gate. We also built a new grotto. Meanwhile, St. Anthony's grotto was renovated and a face lift was given to the entrance of the parish office.

In 2018 Bishop Barthol Ordained Dn. Nelson Cardoza OCD on 17th of April. After his Priestly Ordination Fr. Nelson was given the conventuality in the same community that is Krista Shanti Dham. He simultaneously served in the parish as an assistant priest and pursued his B. Ed studies. In February Fr. Melvin began the long pending project of building New Block (Toilet Block). Besides that, old the water proofing of the church terrace was removed and replaced by tiles to lighten the weight. A synthetic Badminton court was

made on the terrace. The entire church ground was given a facelift by putting interlocks and the roof for the stage was installed. We also installed 2 big fans in the St. Joseph Hall.

In February 2019 Fr. Julius Gonsalves a newly ordained priest was sent to Mira Road to serve in the St. Joseph Church. In May 2019 Fr. Cannio went to Canada for his further mission. In October deacon Roshan arrived for his diaconate ministry in the Parish.

In the year 2020 after the provincial chapter, Fr. Lancy Mendonca who had served in the parish for nearly six years was transferred to Ryshivana Mangalore. Fr. Julius who served as a youth director for a year was transferred to Tapovana Kushalnagar. At the same time, two young priests namely Fr Roshan Monteiro who had served in the same parish as a deacon and Fr Ashwin Prashanth D Souza who were ordained in July arrived at Mira Road as assistant Priests.

In May 2022, Fr Roshan Monteiro left for Bangalore to pursue theological studies. In November 2022, Deacon Nikesh D'Souza joined the community for his

diaconate Ministry. He was ordained in January 2023, and remained in the community till May 2023, later being appointed to the Nagpur Community.

In May 2023, after the Provincial Chapter of Karnataka - Goa Province a New community at Krista Shanti Dham, Mira road was formed under the leadership of

Fr. Regan Paul D'Souza (Superior), Fr. Lawrence D Cunha (Parish Priest), Frs. Walter D Souza, Pawan Saldanha, Ashwin D Silva, Nelson Krist Cardoza and Ashwin D Souza. We bid farewell to Fr. Melwin, who was elected Superior of our Mangalore Monastery.

In October 2023, Deacon Santosh Menezes came to our community for his diaconal ministry. He left the community after completing his ministry in January 2024.

In June 2024, Fr Ivo Dias joined the community, and Fr Walter D Souza left for the Mangalore community. Later Deacon Jeswin Tom Benoy came here for his diaconate ministry,

### **Interview with Deacon Jesvin: My Life, My Journey**

I am Deacon Jesvin Tom Benoy, and I am a Carmelite.

Tom is my middle name; it stands for St. Thomas, my dad is Benoy and my Mum is Gigi. I was born in Kerala and I belong to the Syro-Malabar Rite of the Catholic Church. My family is originally from Alleppey, Kerala, but we are now settled in Kottayam. In 2006 my family moved to Delhi.



### Faith and calling:

My faith, I learnt from my grandparents, whom I have seen praying for souls in purgatory, forgotten souls for whom they prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet. They inculcated in me a deep calling for prayer. The journey of faith continued as I prepared for my Holy Communion at age 7. I observed the priests at the altar, celebrating the Holy Eucharist and saying various prayers. Once I reached Delhi, all this subsided, I deliberately turned a blind eye to the spiritual side of life, I was like any other Delhi boy. After studying commerce in 11th and 12th, I ventured into the professional course, cleared the entrance and while I was at the second IPCC stage of Chartered Accountancy, something happened that triggered my spiritual journey!

### Turning point in my life:

Once at class, we were told that the Institute of CA was established by a law of the Parliament. This made me very proud. I came home and declared the same to everyone gleefully. One of our family friends, an uncle, happened to be home that day, and he retorted, "There is nothing greater that you can do with your life than what the priest does on the Altar." These words created a storm within me and made me introspect. I remember lying on the bed and deeply thinking over what I should do with my life. Then the entire dream I had as a child returned to me, and I decided that I should be a priest. I shared the matter with my Mum, who in turn spoke to my Dad about the same. I needed their support, and they have

stood beside me and are my great supporters along the journey towards the priesthood.

### Why Carmelites?

The first Carmelites I encountered were the Cloistered Nuns of the Delhi Carmel. I met the Carmelite sisters - their long scapulars, their robes, their silent prayerful life, and this told me of the joy and peace they cherish within them. I met the nuns when I was still studying, but when I considered joining seminary seriously, I

tried the MCBS and the SVDs, but somehow, it didn't work out. I then called Rev. Fr. Joe Tauro, OCD, Former Provincial of the KG Province of the Discalced Carmelites. He was then the Rector of Pushpashrama, the Province's Philosophy College at Mysore. He invited me to spend a week there in the company of the community and the brothers. Since my brother was already studying in Mysore, it made me comfortable.

That week, I read the autobiography of St Therese of Lisieux – the Story of a Soul – which deeply impacted me. If she could embrace sanctity doing lowly, through simple tasks, then why not I, was the question that hung over me. Also, the brothers in the seminary, with their religious attire and grace, did captivate me! Hence, I chose to join the Carmelites.

### Formative years:

I joined the seminary in 2014; this is my 11th year as a formee. But the journey is almost over, as I am preparing for my ordination. I must admit, years in formation has its own joys and pains. There is a shift that takes place in you, from being a young adult, a family person, you evolve into a community individual. That shift, I'd say, isn't something very easy. There are lessons learnt in the process. But there is always growth. But God has been really good, kind and benevolent.

I am earnestly happy to be ordained and to start my priestly ministry at the age of 30. I keep in mind that Jesus started his ministry at the age of 30. I wish and



My Priestly Ordination is planned to be held on the 19th of May 2025, at Pushpashrama, Mysore – at the very place where I chose to become a Carmelite. It is like I am preparing for my wedding, my vows to be faithful to Jesus, his teachings and to be faithful to the Church.

### Thoughts for the Youngsters:

depth and conviction!

I see that the world is changing, and a lot of its impact will be borne by the youngsters. Technological advancement, social media and other developments of the time come with benefits as well as downsides. It calls for us to be careful in indulging in it, and to be masters of ourselves rather than becoming slaves to these. My prayers are for the youngsters that in the changing times they may be held strong in faith and their convictions. I pray that they may find favour in the eyes of the Lord!



# MEANING OF THE JUBILEE LOGO

### THE FOUR FIGURES

The logo shows four stylized figures, representing all of humanity, coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figure at the front is holding onto the cross. It is not only the sign of the faith which this lead figure embraces, but also of hope, which can never be abandoned, because we are always in need of hope, especially in our moments of greatest need.

### THE WAVES

There are the rough waves under the figures, symbolising the fact that life's pilgrimage does not always go smoothly in calm waters. Often the circumstances of daily life and events in the wider world require a greater call to hope.

### THE CROSS

The cross in the logo is by no means static, but it is also dynamic. It bends down towards humanity, not leaving human beings alone, but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope.

### THE ANCHOR

The anchor is well known as a symbol of hope. In maritime jargon the 'anchor of hope' refers to the reserve anchor used by vessels involved in emergency manoeuvres to stabilise the ship during storms. It is worth noting that the image illustrates the pilgrim's journey not as an individual undertaking, but rather as something communal, marked by an increasing dynamism leading one ever closer to the cross.

### Recipe: GOAN FISH CURRY - AMBOT-TIK

The bright red Goan Ambot-Tik Curry (literally, sour-n-hot or sour-n-spicy) is an easy, sense-tingling dish - the very thought of it brings back the memory of the aroma and the consequent awakening of the taste buds, no matter how many days or years ago you last tasted it! Though famously known to be cooked with Mori (Shark fish), this can be made with your preferred fish.

Clean, rinse and cut the fish into 1 cm thick pieces. Rub generously with Salt, set aside for 20-30 minutes and then rinse well.

The best part of Goan non-coconut based curry pastes is that they can be made in advance and refrigerated for few weeks.

### **Ingredients for the Ambot-Tik Curry Paste:**

(Grind into a fine, paste with tamarind soaked in water, vinegar and little water)

4 Garlic cloves

1" Ginger

1/4 teaspoon Turmeric powder

1 (flat) teaspoon Cumin Seeds

8 Black Peppercorns

2 Cloves, 1/2" Cinnamon

4 dried Red Bedki Chilies

4 dried Red Kashmiri Chilies

Tamarind (lemon-sized amount) soaked in water

### For the Curry:

1 Medium-sized Onion, finely chopped

The Ambot-Tik Curry Paste

Fish (here, I used about 12 pieces of Shark)

5 Kokum rinds

2 slit Green Chilies

2-3 Tablespoons Oil


Salt to taste


1/2 (+/-) teaspoon Sugar

In a pan (Keep the gas on medium flame) add the oil, add the finely cut onions and let it fry for sometime till its pink and soft...add the masala paste (depending on how much gravy is required). Bring it to a boil..add the slit Green Chilies, kokum and salt to taste along with the sugar. Add the fish after giving a good wash. Let it cook for 8 to 10 mins on slow fire.

Top it with finely cut Coriander....




